

Intermediate Photography:

Continuing the Photographic Journey

Become a more well rounded photographer, capable of success in almost any situation, by adding to your knowledge and practical skills. This course is designed to reinforce the foundations established in Introductory Photography and provide many new experiences, build competence and strengthen confidence. Topics will include, but not be limited to:

- Flash photography: learning to use flash so no one can tell
- Portraiture: making photographs of family and friends that are keepers
- Night photography: creating special effects when the sun goes down
- Editing your photos: An introduction to editing your images to bring out their best
- On Finding Creativity: This topic is a focus throughout the course and includes the completion of a project.
- Other topics include: advanced focusing techniques, HDR (high dynamic range), and more.

The eight weekly sessions will emphasize learning from the work of each other in a coaching format as well as instruction in new techniques. Each week will include assignments and electronic notes, loaded with inspiration, to support your learning.

Equipment: Along with your DSLR, participants will need a tripod, speedlight flash and a diffuser for the flash. Upon registration, information will be provided to help you choose these items.

Schedule: The first lesson is available to you on March 15, 2024
The first of 8 weekly Zoom classes is Thursday, March 21, 2024.
NB: Three of the Thursday sessions are on location (lower mainland).
Saturday outing: May 4, 9:30 - 11:30 am

Fee: \$379.00 + GST.

The course has a maximum of 16 students and includes two teaching assistants.
